

THE HOME BREW SPECIALIST

Craig, KØCF, received his Novice License in May, 1959, and his Conditional in August of the same year. In March of 1969, he made several jumps in one day of examination. In fact, he went from Conditional to Extra Class in one session, scoring 100% on his General and Advanced License theory tests, and then went on to pass the Extra Class examination at the same time.

KØCF wasted no time in becoming active in club activities, served as Vice-President of the University of Iowa Amateur Radio Club, and later as President of the same organization. Craig has been very active in the Iowa City Amateur Radio Club, heading various committees very capably. In 1975 he was elected President of this Club, and in 1976 was elected Vice-President. When Mike Nowack, who was the President, left the area, Craig had the responsibility of being President, Vice-President, and Editor of the RAG. Some job! I think many amateur radio operators are deeply indebted to Craig for his excellent teaching of theory classes. (I, for one, wish to thank him for his help.)

Craig was born in Cherokee, Iowa, attended elementary and high schools in Peterson, Iowa, and then matriculated at the University of Iowa for his advanced education. After graduation from the University of Iowa, Craig spent four years in the U.S. Air Force as a Nuclear Weapons Specialist. He is presently employed by the University of Iowa College of Medicine as an Electronics Engineer in Bio-Engineering.

Originally KNØUJJ, KØCF has been a member of A.R.R.L. for nineteen years continuously, and, therefore, will be eligible for the Old Timer's Club next May. This will be added to his other honors; i.e.,

Worked 50 states in one weekend during Bi-centennial Celebration Contest.

1977 IARU Radio Sport Award for working more stations than anyone in the State of Iowa on phone.

1977 Award for working all Continents on phone in one weekend.

At present he is working for the DXCC Award, and has completed 70% of the required QSO's Good Luck!

Our subject featured in this month's RAG started his amateur operation with a Heath CX-40, crystal-controlled transmitter, later adding an early model Heath VFO. His receiver was an SX 99 Hallicrafter. At the present time Craig operates a Heath SB 102 transceiver, incorporating a home-brew electronic keyer with memory. This feeds into either a tri-band antenna rotating on a tower (which is another of Craig's home-brew accomplishments) or a 40-10 meter vertical with innumerable radials buried in his backyard, or an 80-meter inverted "V." The two-meter equipment consists of a Trio TR 2200 G and a Heath 2036.

Craig, KOCF, is certainly a credit to the Iowa City Amateur Radio Club in particular and to Amateur Radio in general. We wish him 73's and all the QSO's he needs. Craig, a big "Thank you" for the interview.

A new RTTY/AREC Net has been formed. The purpose is to establish a working and reliable local community area network designed for net member check-in and training, promotion of the VHF RTTY Art, passage and handling of traffic with local county-wide area Ec's and Sunday evening 2-meter FM emergency weather nets (or whenever activated), and to provide a centralized meeting place for general RTTY QSO's.
